Why bother with nutrition? A balanced, varied diet will help you to achieve their swimming potential

Why drink? Your performance can be affected and you may run out of energy before the end of a training session or competition if you do not drink enough

#### How? All swimmers need to ensure that they:

- Have the correct amount of energy for normal growth and development
- Have the right foods to build and maintain strong bones and a healthy weight
- Are fit and healthy and not ill as much of the time as possible
- Have enough energy to train and perform well
- Have drunk enough fluid to maintain hydration to be able to perform well in training and competition
- Can recover as quickly as possible from training and competition
- Are able to concentrate on training and school/work In other words food and fluids will affect swimmers on a daily basis and shouldn't be left to chance - EAT & DRINK WELL, SWIM WELL!

# How to raise a concern within the Integrated Swim Programme





The Integrated Swimming Programme (ISP) is the sole responsibility of Newport Live and its paid coaches. This is why swimming club members pay their direct debit to Newport Live and not the swimming Club. All aspects of the training, squad selection and development are decisions made by Newport Live, although there is a degree of consultation with the Club. It is therefore important for members to understand that if you have concerns or complaints that are related to the ISP these should be directed to Newport Live and initially to the respective coach for each squad.

In this situation the Club will provide individuals' with support where concerns have been raised, however, review and resolution remain the responsibility of Newport Live as you have a contractual relationship with them as the supplier of this service.

The Club will address collective concerns with Newport Live but our sphere of influence is limited although we will strive to advocate on your behalf.

The Club exists within the context of Galas, specific competitive training away from Newport and with team events such as Wyvern League and Arena League. In this context the Club and not Newport Live are primarily responsible and concerns should come to the Club unless related to Newport Live Employees.

The below is provided by Newport Live to assist in how to raise a concern or complaint.

# **ISP Squad Programme Update Feb 2020**

The ISP squad program me continues to operate smoothly with swimmers regularly moving through the program. The academy squads have a good turn over of swimmers with new members joining ever other week, and swimmers regularly moving up to Academy 8 and Development.

Consideration is currently being given to review of the squad structure given lower numbers currently in some of the squads and low attendance at some sessions. Also there is a need to balance Development Green sessions which currently include 2 out of 3 sessions on the weekend.

We have now installed a second TV screen to display heart rate and information to swimmers using the new monitors. This will mean more swimmers can benefit from their use in the future.

The first weekend of regionals went well with lots of finals and medals. Over 90 swimmers qualified for the regionals which is really encouraging, however there are only 49 swimmers from Newport competing.

The Wyvern league will be starting soon, which will give plenty of the younger swimmers some good racing experience, so please look out for that, team selection will be coming out imminently.
